Increase of seats in MD(Pathology) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College, Navanagar, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 -Permission of Board of Governors- regarding.

Sir/Madam,

In continuation to this office Letter of Intent dated 19th March, 2012, I am directed to convey the Conditional Permission of Board of Governor for Increase of seats in MD(Pathology) course from 4(Four) to 6(Six) seats with prospective effect, from the academic session 2012-13 at your Institute/college u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

This Letter of Permission is subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:-

- The applicant should provide all infrastructural facilities in terms of teaching and nonteaching staff, buildings, equipment and hospital facilities as per Medical Council of India norms. I am further directed to inform that you and your institution are fully responsible to fulfill and maintain norms including the infrastructure both physical and human resource, teaching faculty and clinical material, etc. throughout the academic year, as stipulated in Postgraduate Regulation of Medical Council of India. In case false/wrong declaration or fabricated documents have been used for procuring permission of the Board of Governors for the starting/increased intake and the said misconduct is brought to notice or comes to the knowledge of Medical Council of India at any stage during the current academic year, your institution is not liable to be considered for increased intake for the next academic year and this letter of permission for the increased intake/starting is also liable to be revoked for current academic year. Besides, Medical Council of India is entitled to take all such measures against you and your college/institution as permissible under the law.
- Other deficiencies if any pointed out in the inspection report should be rectified. A copy of MCI inspection report is enclosed.
- No student should be admitted in the above courses till the formal permission of the Board of Governors is granted.
- The applicant should provide Bank Guarantee of required amount wherever required in favour of Secretary, Medical Council of India, New Delhi valid for three years from a nationalized/scheduled Bank as per MCI's norms against increased intake/starting of above said course. However, Bank guarantee is not applicable for Government institution.
- The college has to give an undertaking that the students admitted to this course shall be paid stipend on par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutes/Central Government Medical Institutions, in the State/Union Territory where the institution is located as required under Clause 13.3 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations.
- Postgraduate students admitted to this course would be required to present one poster presentation to read one paper at a national/state conference and to present one research paper which should be published/accepted for publication/sent for publication during the period of his Postgraduate studies so as to make him eligible to appear at the Postgraduate

degree examination as prescribed in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations notified vide Gazette Notification dated 09/12/2009 (Clause 13.9).

- 7. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations under Clause 14.(4)(a) it has been prescribed that "Every candidate shall carry out work on an assigned research project under the guidance of a recognized Post Graduate Teacher, the result of which shall be written up and submitted in the form of a Thesis. The thesis shall be examined by a minimum of three examiners; one internal and two external examiners, who shall not be the examiners for Theory and Clinical examination. A candidate shall be allowed to appear for the Theory and Practical/Clinical examination only after the acceptance of the Thesis by the examiners."
- 8. The Medical college while making admission to the course shall ensure that:-

i. No admission is permitted beyond the sanctioned intake capacity.

 Selection of students to the Medical College is in accordance with the requirements laid down in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 1997.

iii. No admission is permitted beyond the cutoff date

It shall be incumbent upon the Medical College that the information relating to admission should be submitted within a fortnight of closure of admission to the Council. Any failure to submit the information within this time limit would be construed that the admission in the College were not in accordance with the statutory requirements, thereby enabling the Council to proceed in accordance with law against the college.

You are requested to send compliance to above mentioned conditions including bank guarantee as required under the Regulations of Medical Council of India within 15(Fifteen) days of issue of this letter failing which the Letter of Permission issued for Increase of seats in the above course shall stand cancelled which shall result in forfeiture of right of the college/institution to admit the students in the above course.

The college authorities shall take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 11(2) of the IMC Act at the time of first batch admitted against the course appears for final year examination.
